Eye Protection Roll Out-Plan

Overview

At Phoenix Children's Hospital we are continuously reviewing and updating our clinical practice guidelines based on best practice recommendations as they become available. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention along with Maricopa County Department of Public Health now recommend all healthcare providers wear eye protection in addition to a medical mask for all direct patient encounters (CDC, 2020).

Effective Monday July 20th, 2020 all employees in direct patient care/contact will be required to wear eye protection until further stated. Eye protection can be removed when not in direct patient contact.

PLAN (Outpatient)

1. All outpatient locations will be allocated eye protection
2. Staff located within these locations will obtain eye protection at the beginning of each shift/day from the designated clean bin.
3. Staff will clean eye protection following the Reuse Protocol for N95 Masks and Goggles; **policy #2903**
 - a. Eye protection must be cleaned if visibly soiled, removed from the face, touched on the exterior of the eye protection and at the end of each shift/day
4. If additional eye protection is needed, local leadership can order through eRequest using item #10356.
5. To order clean bins order through eRequest using order #38416.
