She is involved in the development, implementation, and evaluation of education and training programs that facilitate increased adoption of health technologies throughout the VA healthcare system. Her prior experience includes a decade at the Department of Defense where she led an interdisciplinary education and training program aimed at training providers on best practices for health technologies in clinical care. She received her doctorate and master's degrees in clinical psychology, specializing in neuropsychology, from the University of Nevada Las Vegas, and completed her post-doctoral fellowship in Military Research Psychology with the U.S. Department of Defense. She also serves as an adjunct professor at Pepperdine University teaching graduate level courses on ethics and law for mental health professionals, is an Associate Editor of the Journal of Technology in Behavioral Science, as well as serves on the Ethics Committee at the Los Angeles County Psychological Association.
